




Sickness:

If the reason for a student's absence is that they are unwell, they should be kept at home until they are fit enough to return to school. This is particularly important to help prevent the spread of communicable disease. Parents should message the student's class teacher on E-Praise and the school reception before 7:30 AM, explaining illness/reason for absence. A medical/doctor's is required for all illness absences.

This week, we had our very first Annie Kids ECA practice and it went really well! The students were excited, focused and full of energy as they started learning the songs and getting to know their roles.


It was lovely to see them working together and having fun. We can't wait to watch their confidence grow as rehearsals continue - this is just the beginning of an unforgettable journey to the stage!







- Focus on the Positives: Talk about the exciting parts of moving up—making new friends, learning new things or taking on more responsibility.
- **Stay Connected:** If your child seems particularly anxious, let their teacher or myself know. Together, we can offer additional support and reassurance.
